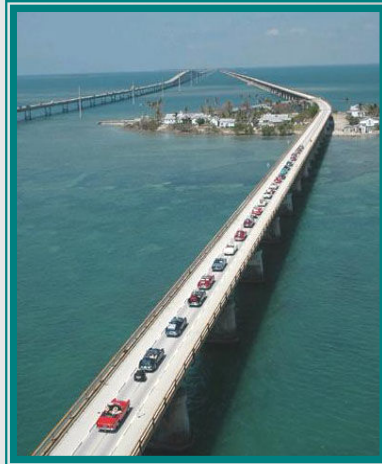

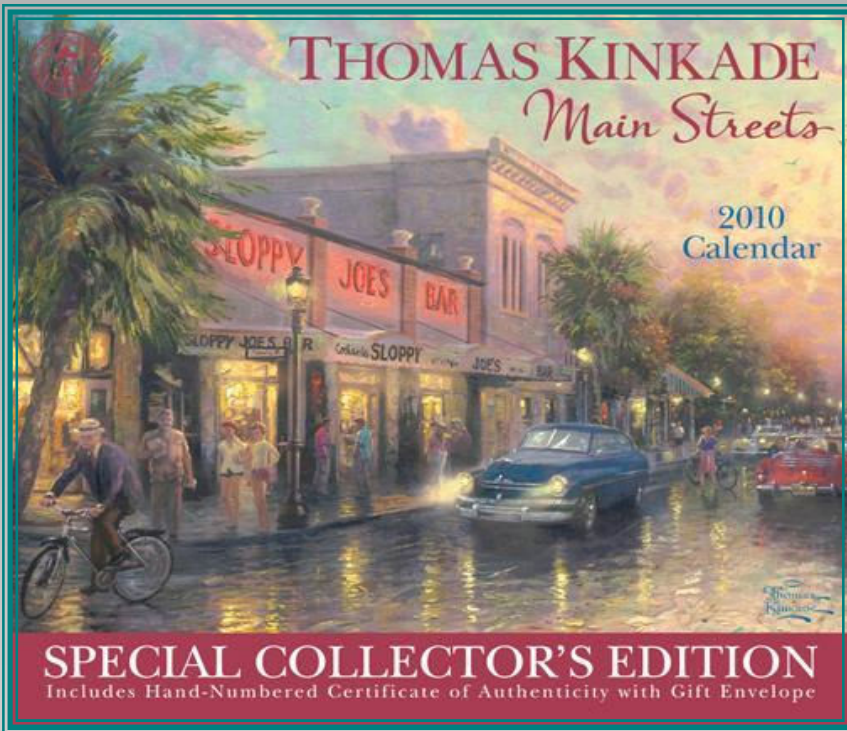

IN HIS OWN WORDS.....

“Key West has long attracted literary luminaries and world figures. Like many visitors, I was attracted by its small town

charm and vividly colored tropical vistas. I have hidden a number of world figures in my Key West print, most notable Ernest Hemingway, who stands in front of his beloved Sloppy Joe’s Bar, where he held court during the last years of his life. I’ve included a number of vintage cars in my painting to suggest the nostalgic charm as evident today as it was in earlier decades in “Key West”. In the clear air and luminous sky of the Caribbean colors rise to vivid heights. I

utilized a broad stroke technique along with much fine detail to capture the festive atmosphere of “Key West”. Between ten and twenty layers of paint, featuring delicate glazine, create the opalescent hues of the Caribbean.

If you have fond memories of America’s southernmost city, if you long for the tropics, or if you simply enjoy the dramatic charm of a bustling town, Key West could be a treasure in your home.”

KEY LIME PIE — Official State Pie

Florida State Pie The road to becoming the official state pie, was not an easy one. In the 1980s, North Florida lawmakers felt that a pie made of pecans, grown in Florida, would better reflect the state’s history. In 1994, the State Legislature officially recognized Key Lime pie as an important symbol of Florida. In 2006 Key Lime Pie Lovers won the battle and Florida’s Legislature voted to make it the official state pie as of July 1, 2006.

Versions of the Pie Every restaurant in the Florida Keys, and especially in Key West, serves this wonderful pie. There seems to be a key lime pie for every palate, with numerous versions made throughout the region/ Graham-

cracker or pastry crust? Plain, Meringue, Whipped Cream or chocolate syrup on top? Cooked or uncooked filling? Any way you make it or serve it, do not ever, not ever, under any circumstance add green food coloring! The filling of authentic key lime pie is a light yellow. The color is derived from the egg yolks and the key lime juice!

History of the Pie Legend says the first key lime pie is attributed to William Curry and his cook known as Aunt Sally. They say that it was Aunt Sally who created the pie in the late 1800s. Some historians think that Aunt Sally didn’t create the Key Lime Pie, but probably perfected a delicacy that was the creation of area fishermen.

No fresh milk, no refrigeration, and no ice was available in the Keys until the arrival of tank trucks with the opening of the Overseas

Highway in 1930. Because of this lack of milk, local cooks had to rely on canned sweetened condensed milk, which was invented in 1856 by Gail Borden. Key lime may be the star ingredient of the key lime pie, but it is the sweetened condensed milk that makes it so smooth and delicious. Sample them all on your next visit to Key West!
