



Even the parking lot is a great place to hang out, swap stories and look at all of the cars.



In addition to the permanent bocce ball courts, the park showcases about 75 different Florida Keys native trees and plants. It also provides a natural habitat for many migrating birds and butterflies. The Park was founded in 1981 to help preserve and protect some the trees and plants.

Skomp's Speed Shop Gears Up for THE HEAT OF THE BATTLE

Here at the Speed Shop, one of the hottest topics is cooling systems ... especially when it comes to the infamous Duval Street parade. Billed as the longest parade in the world

(stretching from the Atlantic Ocean to the Gulf of Mexico), it's really just barely a mile long, but can test your car's cooling system to the max.

Mission: Finish the Battle

This is without a doubt, the most fun parade you will ever participate in. The tropical setting, the cars, the crowds on the street and up in the balconies, the beads, and the unexpected ... it all adds up to an amazing experience! Yet it can be tough on your car if not properly prepared.



I often equate the Conch Republic parade to a WWII bombing mission. You start out with a full squadron. Then, some begin to fall

from formation. As a pilot in the last five missions, I've seen good people bail when they're hit with fluids that begin to spill, or smoke appears in the cockpit. Others, you can hear the engine tone change, and with a stern face, they stall out. I even saw one pilot bail without warning, leaving the navigator to take over ... but I believe that was more an issue of "the pilot just needing a little relief." Anyway, you've got to make sure your equipment is in good shape for a successful mission, and here are a few tips.

The Heat of Battle

Preparation is the key for a successful landing as you round the corner at Sloppy Joes. Aside from

an efficient radiator and proper tuning, check your radiator cap. On many older British cars, especially the MGA, the cap is of a slightly deeper design



than most cars, so you really need to make sure you have the right cap. The original design (on the MGA) was a 4lb cap. A replacement 7lb is a much better option. While this does not actually lower the temp, a good cap will allow for a higher operating temperature without boiling.

Another easy thing to do is turn on the heat and run the blower fan. Yes, it makes for a bit of discomfort inside, but the heater is actually a mini radiator, and when put in use, can be a significant aid in reducing the engine temperature.

The standard radiator cooling fan is adequate in most situations, but when faced with a mile of bead tossing, you may find yourself watching the temp gauge needle move up to about 70lbs of oil pressure! An electric fan placed in front of the radiator certainly can help. Either permanently add an electric fan, or simply add one just for this event. I've prewired my car with bullet connectors, so I can just "slip a fan in for the parade."

Gotta Stay Cool.....Relax

One last point to consider ... DON'T run your engine any more than you need to prior to the start of the parade. The staging area is just around the corner from the Blue Marlin, so run



your car as little as possible to get staged.

Then you can relax and party while allowing the



engine to cool again. Don't start it until you are actually signaled to "move out." This in itself will get you beyond La Te Da without even breaking a sweat!

GOOD EATS and DRINK IN THE KEYS

Our Key West "Gatherers" have found some great places along the Keys to eat, drink and kick-back......and they want to share them with you. So get readyhere they are:

Mike and Sandy Hickman recommend the following:

Alabama Jacks at 5800 Card Sound Road

This place, at the beginning of the Keys is right on the water. We had lunch and watched the Manatees as we dined.

Mangrove Mamas at MM 20 on Route 1.

This is a nice quaint place for a refreshment on the way down



No Name Pub on Big Pine Key North Watson Blvd 1/12 Mi North of US1.

"A nice place if you can find it" is the motto.
This is great Fish Dip and other things.

El Sabone y in Key West is the local's favorite Cuban Food Restaurant at 900 Catherine Street. Very authentic and muy bueno! If it was in Kentucky, it would be a regular on our list!

Half Shell Raw Bar at 231 Margaret Street in Key West has 1/2 price appetizers including oysters on the half shell starting about 4:00.

Duffy's Steak House at 1007 Simonton Street in Key West has prime rib, steaks and key lime pie.

AB Lobster House at 700 Front Street in Key West is a new place on our list to try this year.

Dennis Urick recommends the following-Shrimp Shack on Stock Island is nothing fancy but the Key West Pink shrimp is great and it's right off the boat.

Hogfish Bar on Stock Island is a new place on my list to try. It is on the water and just before the Shrimp Shack.

Another on my list to try this year is the **Geiger Key Marina Restaurant**.....the Blue Moon soaked burger.

Jerry Andres recommends the following Blue Heaven Restaurant at 729 Thomas Street in Key West for breakfast, dinner and awesome mojitos. At the Blue Heaven you sit outside under the trees, the floor is dirt, the chickens are running about and the food is great!!

Camille's Restaurant at 1202 Simonton Street in Key West for breakfast and lunch. It is only a couple of blocks from the Blue Marlin. Great breakfast and excellent sandwiches.

Banana Café at 1215 Duval Street in Key West for the BLT sandwich! I was so impressed with how much bacon was on the sandwich, I took a picture of it!




Hurricane Hole Restaurant and Marina on Stock Island. Excellent Key West Pink Shrimp. The Marina is a great place to schedule a fishing trip with excellent guides! After your trip, for a fee the Restaurant will cook your catch for all to eat and enjoy.

They are assembled and glued in the traditional sandal factory in Kino Plaza at the corner of Greene and Fitzpatrick Streets.

Coach Purse Outlet Located at 517 Duvall Street, in Old Town Key West. This is a great place to buy those wonderful Coach purses at affordable prices.

Del Sol Located at 123 Duvall Street in Old Town Key West. It's fun, solar totes, nail polish that changes colors, cute kids stuff etc....Blue Marlin has a coupon yearly for a free tote.

Key West Toy Factory is a brand new store located at 291 Front Street in the Clinton Square Market in Old Town. It is housed in the gray/white building next to the Custom House on the 2nd floor. Reviews say it is a must visit, the store has unique toys and looks like a scene from Pirates of the Caribbean.
